Enterprise

- Definition

- Enterprise can be defined as the **efforts** people make to achieve **something new**. People have the **initiative** to start projects (generating an idea, identifying a need, spotting a need), to face the **challenges** involved and to take **risks** in order to achieve their **goal**. Enterprise is important in all parts of society. It is **creative** and **innovative**.

Sources of Ideas

Characteristics of Entrepreneurs

- **Confident**
 - They have self belief. They are sure of their goals and believe in their idea and their ability to overcome obstacles
- **Energetic**
 - They are hard working and must inspire others around them to do the same.
- **Resilient/Perservere**
 - They try to find a way around obstacles rather than being overcome by them
- **Risk Takers**
 - Entrepreneurs are prepared to take calculated risks to succeed. They often risk their own money and their own reputation

Characteristics of Entrepreneurs

- **Flexible**
 - Business is dynamic (changing). Entrepreneurs must be able to adapt
- **Future focused**
 - Entrepreneurs are always on the lookout for opportunities/gaps in the market
- **Innovative/creative**
 - Entrepreneurs create products or services new to the market or carry out developments on existing ones. “Outside the box” thinking!
- **Motivated**
 - They demonstrate a driving need for achievement and success. They set high standards and have an innate desire to be successful

Skills of Entrepreneurs

- **Good Communicators**
 - They must be able to communicate well with all parties in business. **Oral and written** communication skills are important
- **Inner Control**
 - Entrepreneurs believe that they can **influence** events and make things happen. They don't believe in **fate**. They **take charge** of their own destiny
- **Planning and Goal setting**
 - Entrepreneurs must set **short term and long term objectives** and **formulate plans** to achieve these. Planning is a skill that can be acquired with practice
- **Assessing and Managing Risk**
 - Measuring, assessing and managing risk means conducting an **analysis** of given situations and making decisions. Once the level of risk has been **calculated** the entrepreneur must **devise policies** to eliminate or reduce the risk (risk management)
- **Decision-making**
 - This involves making the best decisions as opposed to making quick ones. All **options are weighed up** and the best one is chosen.

Skills of Entrepreneurs

- **Human Relations**
 - Entrepreneurs must acquire HR skills to deal with different personalities they encounter in business.
- **Time management**
 - This involves completing tasks within the allotted time and eliminating activities that waste time. They must learn to prioritise and meet deadlines
- **Stress Management**
 - Entrepreneurs, particularly when starting out, are under huge pressure to succeed. They may have loans that must be repaid. Stress can be managed through delegation and personal discipline regarding holiday time/family time
- **Networking**
 - Establishing business contacts is a skill that allows you to develop links that may benefit your business.

Enterprise Action

- **Community Enterprise**

- Eg: setting up a group who visits and reads to older people
- Eg: Fundraising by the community to build a sports centre

- **School Enterprise**

- Eg: Starting a “Green School” project

- **Business Enterprise**

- Eg: A city centre laundrette owner starting a new service collecting bags of laundry from people at their office in the morning
- Eg: Two IT graduates form a software development company

Enterprise Action

- **Public sector Enterprise Examples:**
 - Setting up the International Financial Services Centre (IFSC) in Dublin to attract banks and provide employment
 - Organising and building the Luas extension and connections
 - The local corporations and county councils running concerts or cultural events in parks around the country
- **In the work place**
 - **Intrapreneur:** A person who is innovative and enterprising, who **identifies new opportunities** and transforms them into profitable activities **within an organisation**
 - They do not bare the same risk as entrepreneurs
 - For intrapreneurs to flourish the company must allocate resources to the intrapreneur, and give them freedom to pursue their ideas. There must be a tolerance of risk-taking and mistakes
 - Eg: A designer in the marketing department suggests a change from plastic to paper packaging. This improves presentation of the product, makes packaging cheaper and helps the environment

Enterprise in Action

- **Personal Enterprise**

- Considering alternatives, evaluating risks and making decisions that affect your future
- Eg: Choosing what house to buy, where to go to college, what career to pursue

- **Domestic Enterprise**

- Eg: Doing some DIY around the house
- Eg: Converting the attic into a bedroom
- Eg: Growing your own vegetables at home

Enterprise in Action

- **Social Enterprise**

- Social enterprises are businesses that are changing the world for the better. Like traditional businesses they aim to make a profit but it's what they do with their profits that sets them apart – reinvesting or donating them to create positive social change.

- **Employment Creation:** Entrepreneurs employ people to help them run their business.
